11. A Status on IUT Working groups

According to new IUT governance structure and work programme drafted at the IUT board meeting in Glasgow, IUT board members have been asked to nominate national experts for two working groups, "Energy Policy" and "General housing policy".

The WGs are part of IUTs new Work Programme.

The working groups will deal with relevant legislative proposals and prepare statements and policy papers.
