Tenants' Milestones for the new European Parliament 2014-2019

The Social Dimension of the European Urban Policy - Tenants make cities!

1) Everybody should have the right to affordable and decent housing- the right to housing is a fundamental right

2) EU state aid rules must favour investment in affordable rental housing - the allocation of social and affordable rental housing has to be decided at Member States' level

3) Fight energy poverty: ensure that enough EU-public funding is committed to make energy-efficient housing affordable for low and middle-income groups

4) Tenure neutral policies – redirect funding towards affordable rental housing



Social housing and the EU (I)

- * EU state aid rules: **social housing only for "disadvantaged citizens"**
- IUT: violation of the principle of subsidiarity, limitation of target group undermines social mix, middle income groups need access to affordable housing too, marginalization of the social housing sector
- 27% tenants in in EU spend more than 40 % of their net income on housing
- → Striving to change EU definition: Parliamentary reports and decisions of EU stakeholders supporting us: Committee of the Regions (CoR), European Economic and Social Committee (EESC), European Parliament (EP), Federal council of Germany (Bundesrat), Dutch Parliament, Austrian association of cities and towns, EUROCITIES, mayors of European big cities
- → Theme of the **EU housing partnership**



Social housing and the EU II

- CoR: petition signed by 250 local authorities claiming their freedom to determine social housing target group
- **EESC:** adoption of an opinion on social housing definition
- European Parliament: initiative report asking for clarification of the definition + minimum quota of social housing in dense cities
- EUROCITIES (network of big EU cities) policy statement asking for the deletion of "disadvantaged citizens" from EC decision 2012/21/EU
- Resolution of mayors of 30 European capitals and big cities claim to leave the type of social housing provision at state, regional and local level.
 "We comply with important stakeholders such as Housing Europe, the federation of public, cooperative and social housing, and IUT, the International Union of Tenants."



European Semester EU stability and growth pact

- EU stability and growth pact: Member States submit national reform programs to European Commission (EC) every year
- EC issues Country-Specific Recommendations which should contribute to reach Europe 2020 targets i.a. lifting 20 million people out of poverty
- Is this actually the case? EC asked the Netherlands to downsize social housing sector, and Sweden to deregulate rental market
- IUT seeks to influence EC officials; strategic partnerships with MEPs to promote a more "social" semester
- Maastricht criteria: 3% threshold of deficit to GDP barrier for national housing investment programs
- IUT claim: Allow a "golden and silver rule" for social investments like housing- theme of the EU housing partnership



Energy legislation (I)

- Building sector is central to energy transition as it represents 40% of final energy consumption
- IUT claim: energy transition should be affordable for tenants
- In 21 European countries renovation costs may be passed on to the rent!
- IUT claim: total housing costs should not increase after energy renovation
 - Prevent "renovictions"



Energy legislation (II)

- ◆ Guaranteed energy savings and long term public investment in energy efficiency → best solution to fight energy poverty
- ◆ IUT replied EC consultation on the evaluation of the Energy Performance of Buildings Directive → raising awareness of tenants through energy labels and their display in multiple storey buildings; strengthening the link between energy performance and rent prices; providing larger long term public funding



EU funds for affordable housing

- Regional development funds (ERDF): up to 20% for energy efficient refurbishment of housing
- Funds for strategic investment EFSI: EC + European Investment Bank (EIB) guarantee for private projects on housing and energy
- EIB lending for urban renewal and social housing projects as well as housing for refugees



EU urban agenda and housing partnership

- Goal of urban agenda: involve cities in the design of urban policies at EU and national level- crucial for housing policy
- IUT nominated member of the housing partnership: ensure affordable housing for citizens
- 3 principles: better knowledge, better funding and better regulation- remove barriers at EU and national level
- 3 working groups: competition and state aid, finance, general housing policy. IUT is nominated as rapporteur on security of tenure, tenant participation and rent stabilization mechanisms

- European Responsible Housing Initiative first European
 Corporate social responsibility initiative for housing
- European Declaration on responsible housing and CSR Code of Conduct for the housing sector
- European Awards held every 2 years: rewarding best companies "providing more than a roof over people's head"
